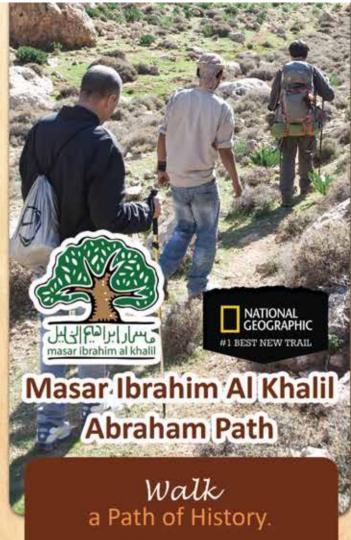

Masar Ibrahim offers you an itinerary of up to ten days to enjoy the olive groves, the remote villages, the Bedouin encampments, the desert and the hospitality of the local communities Masar Ibrahim Al Khalil (MIAK) is a non-profit community-based tourism initiative to delineate, and develop Masar Ibrahim (Abraham Path) in and around the different Palestinian localities. The organization endorses cultural diversity and exchange, safeguards tradition and heritage, inspires storytelling and encourages friendships based on the advancement of human values and the preservation of the surrounding environment and the people's needs for further growth and education. MIAK works closely and jointly with the local communities to cultivate their resources, capacities and the opportunity for a better life.

- The Masar Ibrahim is a trail that extends from the area west of Jenin to the area south of the Sanctuary of Abraham or the Ibrahimi Mosque (known in Arabic as Al-Haram Al-Ibrahimi) in the city of Al-Khalil (Hebron).

Explore the amazing diversity of landscapes and views present in Palestine. Traverse the lands extending from the agricultural fields and olive groves in the north, rambling through the valleys and mountains overlooking the Jordan valley to reach the wilderness of the south.

Meet the charming people along the path and enjoy their warm hospitality and friendship. Indulge yourself by staying in one of the Masar Ibrahim home-stays or Bedouin encampments offered by members of the local Palestinian communities along the path.

Experience Palestinian traditional food and culture. Taste fresh homemade meals served with passion and learn about local customs and traditions.
